1.0 INTRODUCTION

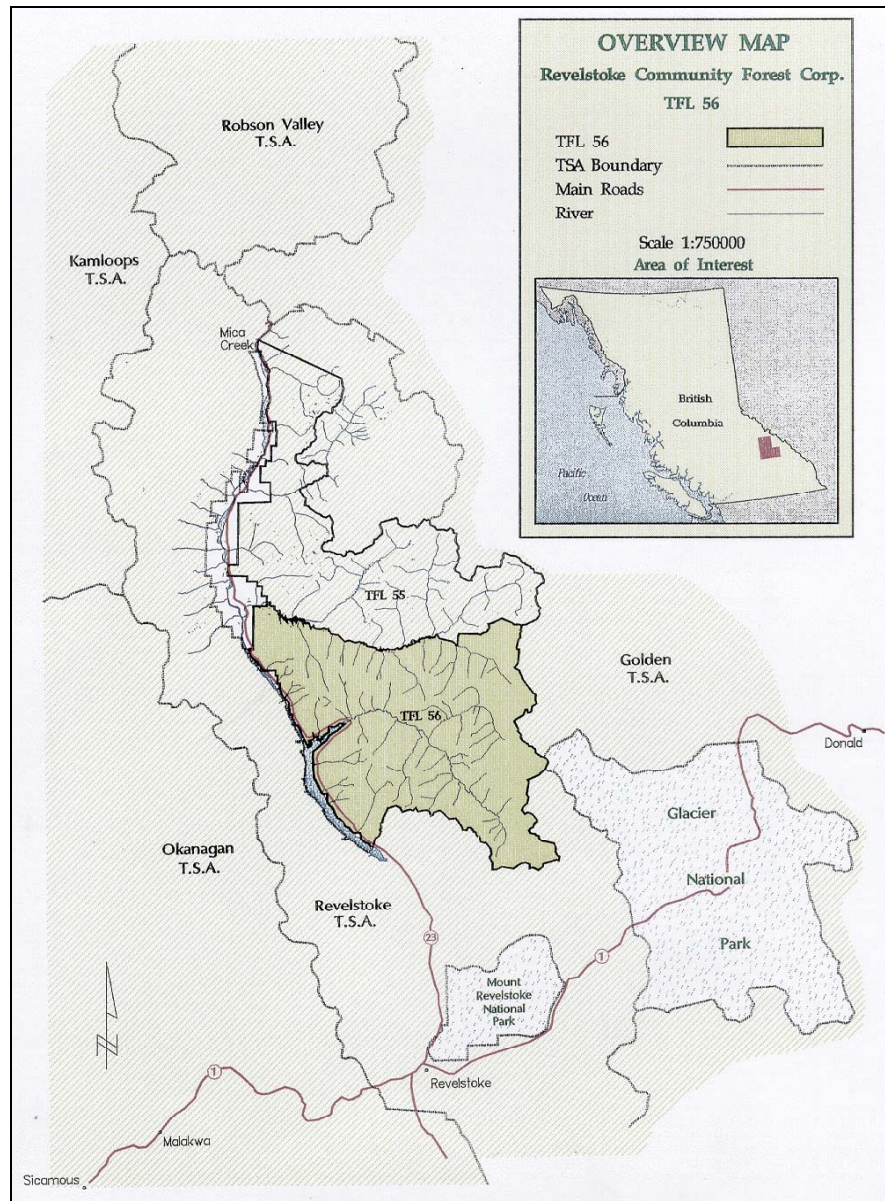


Figure 1: Location of TFL 56

This Forest Stewardship Plan has been prepared for Revelstoke Community Forest Corporation's Tree Farm License 56. Revelstoke Community Forest Corporation (RCFC) operates Tree Farm License 56 (TFL 56) in the Downie and Goldstream Valleys north of Revelstoke. TFL 56 has an annual allowable cut of 90,000 m³, and a total landbase of 119,748 hectares. An overview map is provided in Figure 1.

The Forest Stewardship Plan is a requirement of the *Forest and Range Practices Act* – this act came into effect in January 2004 and replaced the 1995 *Forest Practices Code Act*. The FSP is a landscape-level plan that replaces the Forest Development Plan (FDP).

The FDP provided very specific details on all proposed roads and blocks. The FSP instead provides broad strategies and desired results for conserving and protecting timber and non-timber resources. More specifically, the FSP links government objectives with results and strategies:

- ◆ **Objectives** are identified in the Higher Level Plan and GAR orders and legislation such as the *Forest and Range Practices Act (FRPA)* and provide broad direction to the FSP
- ◆ **Results** are measurable targets defined in the FSP
- ◆ **Strategies** are simply strategies on how the objectives will be met

A 5-year extension has been requested under Section 6(2) of the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and granted. The term of this plan will be an additional 5 years from the date of approval.

2.0 FOREST DEVELOPMENT UNITS

Forest Development Units (FDU's) indicate areas that will contain forest development activities, and that will have a common set of objectives, results, and strategies. The boundaries of the FDU's are indicated on the FSP map (Appendix 6). There are two FDU's included in this plan, and they together cover the entire TFL area. The FDU's do not extend beyond the TFL boundaries.

3.0 FRPA SECTION 196 AREAS

Cutblocks and roads that have been approved in the previous FDP and that have all necessary assessments completed (as required in FRPA Sec. 196 (1)), are listed in Appendix 1. These blocks and roads retain the approvals granted in the previous FDP and are not subject to further review in this plan.

4.0 OTHER PLANS

The *Revelstoke Higher Level Plan Order* (RHLPO) and the Ungulate Winter Range #U-3-005 (B.C. Reg. 582/2004) (GAR) has recently been implemented. RCFC complied with the predecessor to this plan (The Revelstoke Minister's Advisory Committee Plan) and will continue to comply with all aspects of the *Revelstoke Higher Level Plan Order* and Ungulate Winter Range #U-3-005 (Appendix 3).

5.0 OBJECTIVES, STRATEGIES, AND RESULTS

The Forest Planning and Practices Regulation (FPPR) identifies several objectives that must be defined in an FSP. The Government Actions Regulation (Ungulate Winter Range #U-3-005) (GAR) lists measures that may be applicable to an area in an FSP. The Revelstoke Higher Level Plan Order has several items for which objectives, strategies and results exist. The GAR Order and HLPO are law that prevail over this FSP. Therefore, any reference to results and strategies has been repealed. The Columbia Forest District has objectives for two recreation sites within TFL 56. All these are listed in Tables 2A to 2C (or in the *Support Document*) along with their applicability to RCFC's TFL.

6.0 Stocking Standards

RCFC has adopted the stocking standards created by the local office of the Ministry of Forests (Version 3.0). These standards were developed by the Ministry of Forests in consultation with local forest practitioners and are included in Appendix 2. The following criteria apply:

- 1) FPPR Section 16(1) – DCO Stocking Standards Version 3.0 and FPPR Section 44 (Free Growing Stands Generally) apply to both the Downie and Goldstream Forest Development Units (FDU's).
- 2) FPPR Section 16(3) – Section 44(1) applies to all areas with a free growing obligation in the Downie and Goldstream FDU's.
- 3) FPPR Section 16(4) – DCO Stocking Standards Version 3.0 for intermediate cutting will be applied to areas referred to in FPPR section 44(4) for both the Downie and Goldstream FDU's.

7.0 Other Measures

“Other” measures listed below apply to all Forest Development Units in this Forest Stewardship Plan.

7.1 Invasive Plants

Where the introduction or spread of invasive plants is likely, the following measures will be used:

- ◆ Minimize soil disturbance,
- ◆ Seed cut slopes of new roads to reduce the available seedbed for invasive plants within 2 years if natural vegetation is not occurring (60% ground cover on suitable growing substrates (not rock, etc.),
- ◆ Monitor roadsides and cutblocks for invasive species (to date few invasive plants have been noted on the TFL and if they start to appear, it will be noted on the appropriate inspection document), and
- ◆ Where seeding is undertaken, obtain seed from reputable suppliers to ensure that introduction of invasive plant seed is minimized.

7.2 Range Barriers

There are no range activities within, or adjacent to, TFL 56.

8.0 CUMULATIVE EFFECT OF MULTIPLE FSP'S

BC Timber Sales Okanagan, Columbia currently has an FSP within TFL 56 in the Daydream and Nightmare drainages.

9.0 REVIEW AND REFERRAL

The Ministry of Forests & Range (MFR) has produced a 30-day notification letter to interested First Nations groups. Due to the minor revisions of the FSP extension request it was deemed by the MFR that no other review or referral was required by RCFC.

Full information on review and comment from the initial FSP submission can be found in the *Review and Comment Document*.

10.0 REVISIONS

All revisions to the FSP are listed in Appendix 5.

11.0 MAPS
